The elective modules may also be taken voluntarily as an additional qualification, and as frequently as desired. When requested, they may also be separately identified as additional qualification on the master's transcript, including a grade and the number of credits.

Elective modules only count toward the final grade point average if they are necessary to accumulate the 300 credits mandatory for graduation.
